

# CM Gupta Expresses Displeasure Over Disorder at Rohini Sub-Registrar's Office

CM Issues Strict Orders to Rectify Sanitation, Repairs, Seating Arrangements, AC Systems, and Lighting Within One Week

Delhi Chief Minister Smt. Rekha Gupta on Friday conducted a surprise inspection of the Revenue Department's E-Sub-Registrar Offices VI-A (Model Town/Pitampura) and VI-C (Rohini), operating from Ambedkar Bhawan in Rohini Sector-16. During the visit, she reviewed the condition of the office building, citizen facilities, cleanliness, record management and the services being provided to the public. The Chief Minister expressed displeasure over the dilapidated condition of the building, poor lighting arrangements, non-functional air-conditioners, broken flooring, unclean toilets, inadequate seating and negligence in maintenance. She told officials that such disorder was unacceptable in a place where a large number of people visit every day for



important documentation and property-related work. The Chief Minister also interacted directly with citizens present at the office and listened to their grievances. Several citizens complained about having to wait for long periods while standing, inadequate seating arrangements, the absence of a token system, poor air-conditioning and the lack of other basic facilities. Directing the concerned officials on the spot, she said that citizens should not face any inconvenience and that it is the government's responsibility to provide a dignified and comfortable environment in public offices. Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said that the condition of the office building had remained neglected for years. Expressing surprise,

she said that if lights were not working, toilets were unusable, floors were damaged and even basic seating arrangements for citizens were unavailable, it raised serious questions about administrative accountability. She directed the concerned officials to submit complete records of all correspondence and repair proposals related to the matter. During the inspection, the Chief Minister also expressed concern over scrap material, unused items and the disorganised management of records in the building. She directed that clear responsibility be fixed for the regular upkeep and maintenance of the premises and that a responsible officer or caretaker be designated in every office to ensure regular monitoring of basic facilities, cleanliness and maintenance. The Chief Minister directed officials to complete the necessary facelift and improvement works within one week. This includes replacing all faulty lights, repairing air-conditioners, fixing broken floors and tiles, ensuring cleanliness, providing adequate benches and seating arrangements for citizens and developing better facilities for people waiting.

# CM Rekha Gupta Announces Free DTC Travel for NEET Candidates on Exam Day

The Delhi Government, under the leadership of Chief Minister Smt. Rekha Gupta, has taken an important decision to facilitate candidates appearing for the National Eligibility-Entrance Test (NEET). The Chief Minister announced that all NEET candidates will be able to travel free of cost on DTC buses on June 21, the day of the examination, and reach their respective examination centres. To avail themselves of this facility, candidates will only be required to show their valid NEET admit card to the bus conductor. Chief Minister Rekha Gupta said that following the recent cancellation of the NEET examination, many candidates are having to appear for the test again. In such a situation, it is natural for candidates and their families to face additional men-

tal financial and time-related pressure. Understanding these challenges, the Delhi Government stands with the candidates. The government's effort is to ensure that candidates do not face any transportation-related inconvenience on the day of the examination. With this objective, free travel in DTC buses will be provided to all NEET candidates on June 21 so that they can reach their examination centres on time without any additional stress and take the examination with complete concentration and confidence. The Chief Minister said that the time, hard work and future of the youth are extremely important. The Delhi Government is committed to ensuring that candidates receive every possible support and convenience during their education and competitive

examinations. Important examinations such as NEET are closely linked to the lives and futures of candidates. At such a time, it is the responsibility of the government to provide as much support and convenience as possible on the day of the examination so that candidates do not face any unnecessary difficulty or stress. Extending her best wishes to all NEET aspirants, CM Rekha Gupta said that the examination is an opportunity to give a new direction to their hard work, dedication and dreams. She urged candidates to appear for the examination with confidence and wished them a bright future. She also appealed to all NEET candidates to show their admit cards to the bus conductor while travelling on DTC buses on June 21 and avail themselves of the free facility being provided by DTC.

# Delhi Teen Wanted 'Gangster-Like' Image, Flaunted Guns Online, Arrested

Delhi Police arrested a minor on Friday who was allegedly using social media to flaunt weapons and project a criminal image. The teenager was wanted in an arson case, where he and his associates are accused of setting a man's motorcycle on fire after he refused to lend them the vehicle to purchase alcohol. Police said the minor has previously been involved in five cases, including snatching, assault, theft, arson and attempt to murder. Officials added that despite his young age, he was actively involved in criminal activities and was trying to build a gangster-like image through social media. During investigation, police found that the accused operated an Instagram account under the name "CRIME" with the username "king\_of\_azaadpur\_001". Through these



accounts, he regularly uploaded videos and posts showing himself brandishing weapons in an attempt to create fear and intimidation among local residents. He was also fond of keeping and flaunting illegal arms to maintain his dominance, criminal reputation and terror in the area. He also has a tattoo reading "Crime" on his wrist. A team from the Special Staff had been monitoring local criminals and their social media activity for some time. Based on technical surveillance and local inputs, police traced the accused's location and apprehended him. During questioning, it emerged that the minor had been frequently changing locations to avoid arrest.

# AIIMS subway is full, a shelter 2 km away empty

Seated inside the subway leading to AIIMS Delhi, Gopal Acharya, a resident of Uttar Pradesh, wipes sweat from his forehead. The enclosed metro passage has become the only source of respite for Acharya and his wife during Delhi's intense summer heat. "We thought it would be much simpler, but the heat is a bit too much to bear. At night, we stay inside the subway since it is safer and not as hot as sleeping outside on the pavement," Acharya said. When asked whether he knew about the summer shelters set up by the Delhi Urban Shelter Improvement Board (DUSIB), the couple said they had received no information. "I have been here for over a week, attending to my mother every day, and nobody has informed us," he said. "Staying outside has become increasingly difficult as temperatures continue to rise." While DUSIB stated that posters about the shelters had been put up across major hospitals — including Ram Manohar Lohia Hospital, AIIMS Delhi, Lady Hardinge Medical College and Hospital, and Safdarjung Hospital — many patients and attendants said they were still unaware of the facilities. At present, Delhi has 13 summer shelters, all operated by the Society for Promotion of Youth & Masses (SPYM), a non-governmental organisation managing multiple shelters across the city. The summer shelter initiative began on May 15. The shelters are located within roughly a 3-km radius of major hospi-

tals and include facilities at Kidwai Nagar Community Hall, Laxmi Bai Nagar Community Hall, Moti Bagh Community Hall, Mandir Marg Community Hall, Kaka Nagar Community Hall, Babu Dham Community Hall, Khan Market Community Hall, Lodhi Road Community Hall, Green Park Community Hall.
